### **DRB & P&Z Commission**

April 10 P&Z will review Pitmaster's Pizzeria signage variance, Hershberger freight container use as a storage container and discuss revision to minimum square footage requirements for single family dwellings.

### **Wooster Road Speed Study**

Discussion with David Hoffman re: establishing business district boundaries and determining desired speed limits for North Clay/Wooster Road and S. Clay/S. Washington Streets. Discussion: Much discussion and many questions and comments about the speed limits of the north-south streets in the village took place. David Hoffman from ODOT District 11 was present to answer questions and give additional information about speed studies, business/rural districts, ODOT rules and regulations, signage, and historical data for village speed limits. Hoffman advised that speed studies should weigh heavily when making decisions about speed limit changes. Other factors are considered such as continuity of speed zones, business district parameters, length of speed zones, and advisory speeds. His advice to council was to make a decision about speed limits, draft an ordinance and submit it to ODOT for review. ODOT will review the proposed speed zones and either approve them or make recommendations.

Motion made by Vaughn to establish a 25MPH speed limit on North Clay Street from Jackson Street north to Uhl Street and 35MPH from Uhl Street north on Wooster Rd to the corporation limit. Hofstetter seconded the motion. Kellogg voted no. All others voted yes. Motion passed.

Vaughn made a motion for the speed limit on South Clay Street to be established as 25MPH to the intersection of S Washington St. Conn Seconded the motion. Kellogg and Shoemaker voted no. Vaughn, Conn, Polen, and Hofstetter voted yes. Motion passed.
