VISITORS

Judge Tom Lee of the Holmes County Probate Court addressed the council about a project that he and the other board members of the Volunteer Guardianship Program of Holmes County are working on bringing to fruition. Lee explained that Holmes County may have more nursing home beds per capita than most other counties in Ohio. Many of the residents in long-term care in Holmes County nursing homes have no family/guardian to advocate for them and look after their needs and are considered wards of the state. For about the past 15 years, Holmes County has implemented a Volunteer Guardianship Program in which community members voluntarily become a guardian of the ward.

In speaking to local funeral home directors, an issue/need has been identified. Over the past 30 or so years, local funeral homes have held around 80 sets of unclaimed cremains. The goal of the project that Lee and the other Volunteer Guardianship Program board members, including Patricia Shaw, also in attendance, is to deal with these cremains in a dignified manner rather than keeping them stored at funeral homes. They have discussed different options and feel that the best option would be for the cremains to be buried in individual, very basic, sealed containers. The burial site would be marked with the names, date of birth and date of death for each individual buried there. Lee said that the cost of the markers will be covered by the County. He is hoping that the county will also cover the cost of the containers.

Judge Lee asked council to consider helping this project in the following ways:

- -Provide/donate a space in Oak Hill Cemetery for the burial site
- -Assist in the recordkeeping
- -Provide the labor involved with burial and waive the cost

Troyer explained the proposed location of the burial site is situated near the tree line in the same area as the columbarium. It is a very nice setting with a couple of stone benches already in place and where there are no burial sites.

Lee would also like to have a public dedication/memorial service at some point once the project is complete.

There were several questions from council members about the logistics of the burial such as how far apart the boxes will be buried, the location of the site, and protection on the top of the boxes.

Also discussed was the possibility that after the burial of the cremains, a family member could at some point come forward and wish to retrieve the cremains. The consensus among council is that the cost associated with disinterment of cremains would fall on the requestor.

Another topic of discussion initiated by Clerk-Treasurer Shaffer was that once the existing cremains are buried, there shouldn't be ongoing issue with this as there are State laws in place that dictate the procedure for indigent funerals. If the deceased body of an indigent person is unclaimed, it is the duty of the municipality or township to provide cremation of the deceased person and law states that a grave marker must be put in place. State funds, if available, can sometimes reimburse the township or municipality for a portion of the cost.

Lastly, the topic of unclaimed cremains of US Veterans was discussed. If there are in fact unclaimed cremains of indigent US Veterans being held, there are likely programs through the Veteran Affairs for burial at a National Cemetery; the nearest of which is Ohio Western Reserve National Cemetery in Seville.

Motion:

A motion for the Village of Millersburg to proceed with the participation in the project to provide a burial site at Oak Hill Cemetery, recordkeeping (Cemetery Sexton along with Probate Court and Volunteer Guardianship Board), and labor for burial of the unclaimed cremains of indigent persons currently being held at local funeral homes.
