DRB & P&Z Commission: Informed Council the DRB met on November 2nd at 6:00 PM and approved a COA application for signage at 138 W. Jackson Street.

<u>Resurfacing/Sidewalk Projects:</u> Informed Council the entire 2022 resurfacing project is complete. Informed Council ODOT TAP Project legislation is on the agenda to proceed with the project.

ARPA Projects: Informed Council plan development continues and we are seeking funding options.

<u>Appalachian Community Grant:</u> Informed Council a group of County and local officials will be meeting next week to compile projects and begin the first application for the recently released funding from the State. The application will be submitted as one large project, with multiple entities throughout the county including their individual project. Troyer noted for Millersburg, he is anticipating a project for new main street lighting, new power/receptacles, and possibly some sidewalk replacement for the main street area.

<u>PFAS Cost Recovery:</u> Informed Council after review by Solicitor Hines, Nate Skolmutch and himself, they have enrolled in a cost recovery program offered through Ohio Rural Water. Per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) are man-made chemicals which are more prevalent in airports, firefighting, landfills, etc. While Millersburg does not currently have any levels in our water, this could be beneficial in the future if that should ever change. There is no cost to the Village.

<u>Dump Truck:</u> Informed Council we were notified that our new dump truck should be delivered early December.

<u>Aggregation</u>: Informed Council a new rate was released for the aggregation program at 7.32 per c.f. Rates for 12/24/36/48 months ranging from 8-19 cents per c.f. Council agreed to wait on selecting a new plan/rate, as the rate still seems on the high side.

<u>Capital Improvement Fees:</u> Asked Council if they have decided on a capital improvement rate to be added to the water/sewer bills for the next billing cycle. Council opted to add \$22.50 for Residential; \$67.50 for Commercial; and \$157.50 for Industrial utility accounts. One-half of each of these amounts collected will be deposited to the Water R & I Fund and to the Sewer R & I Fund. These fees will generate approximately \$75/80 thousand for each fund for the use of capital improvements. Solicitor Hines will prepare the ordinance for the next meeting.

<u>October Financial Statement:</u> Presented the October Financial Statement and acknowledgement form that Council received the report consisting of the Bank Reconciliation; Appropriation Summary, Fund Summary, Revenue Summary, Payment Summary, and Payroll.

<u>Solicitor Contract:</u> Noted they were provided a copy of the new one-year contract for Solicitor Robert Hines and asked for any questions or comments. Motion made by Conn to approve the contract and authorized the Mayor to sign the same. Seconded by Vaughn. Upon roll call, motion carried with Conn, Vaughn, Polen, Hofstetter, Hoffee, and Shoemaker voting aye. Vote Aye 6 – No 0.

2023 Bed Tax Grant Applications: Noted they were sent the 2023 Bed Tax Grant Applications submitted by the four (4) designated recipients and asked for any questions or comments. A motion was made by Hofstetter to approve the applications as submitted. Seconded by Conn. Upon roll call, motion carried with Hofstetter, Conn, Shoemaker, Hoffee, Vaughn, and Polen voting aye. Vote Aye 6 – No 0.

<u>Tree City Board Members</u>: Told Council three (3) terms are expiring on the Tree City Board on Dec. 31, 2022. These terms are for a three-year period and will end Dec 31, 2025. Shaffer noted she contacted the three members. Arlie Rodhe and Brent Hofstetter agreed to another term, while Doug Polen declined. A motion was made by Conn to appoint Rodhe and Hofstetter to the new term starting Jan. 1, 2023. Seconded by Hoffee. Upon roll call, motion carried with Conn, Hoffee, Polen, Hofstetter, Vaughn, and Shoemaker voting aye. Vote Aye $6 - No \ 0$. Council instructed Hofstetter to ask attendees at the next Tree City Commission meeting if there was any interest in someone filling the open seat.

<u>CSB Platinum Savings:</u> Informed Council CSB has proposed a Platinum Savings Account as a tool for earning additional interest of Village funds. The Sweep Account is currently earning .75% interest.

Switching to a Platinum Account would earn the Village 2.5% interest. Council is extremely interested and asked Shaffer to obtain additional information.
