VISITORS

Eric Strouse, candidate for Holmes County Commissioner introduced himself. He explained that when there is a Presidential Election, the primary election which is typically held in May is moved to March. So, the next Holmes County Commissioner will be elected in March rather than May 2024. Strouse is a Holmes County resident. He graduated from West Holmes, as did his children. He graduated from The Ohio State University with an agricultural degree. He has over 40 years of finance/banking experience. He has served on the West Holmes Local School Board for 24 years. He has worked with Habitat for Humanity for 25 years. Strouse wants to preserve the culture of Holmes County. He is not in favor of huge billboard advertisements or roundabouts. Traffic issues in the county are a growing concern. Strouse has lived in Holmes County all his life and has a good feel for what the people here want.

<u>David Crilow</u>, candidate for Holmes County Commissioner introduced himself. He has been a Holmes County resident for 65 years. He served as Hardy Township Trustee for 32 years. The township accomplished many goals during that time using taxpayer resources wisely and during that time they never went to the voters for more money. Crilow worked for Pomerene Hospital for 23 years. He now serves at the Holmes County Board of DD in many capacities including grant applications and project management. The theme throughout his working life has been that he manages the spending of taxpayer money wisely. He has volunteered many years with Holmes Fire District 1, the American Red Cross and he teaches hunter safety courses. If Crilow is elected as the next commissioner, he is ready to continue to serve this county.

Shirley Gerber, Millersburg resident addressed council to say thank you to some people. Gerber first thanked the street and utilities departments for the work done recently on Wooster Road. She explained that she recognized that they worked efficiently and diligently, and the finished project was very well done. Next, Gerber thanked the Tree City Committee for the efforts in taking care of problem trees and seeing to it that new trees are planted. She appreciates that the committee took care of a large, dead buckeye tree along her property and planted a new one at no cost to her. Lastly, Gerber thanked Mayor Huebner for his many years of serving Millersburg as its Mayor. The village has come a long way during Heubner's years of service. He worked hard and was dedicated to the village.

Troyer agreed. Troyer said that a direct call applet in the app was suggested. The direct call feature would dial the main Village of Millersburg line.

N. & S. Clay Speed Limits

Review of calculations of commercial vs. residential frontage for determining business district boundaries. From the square to the north corporation limit is 54% commercial usage. From the square south to the corporation limit is 77% commercial. However, David Hoffman from ODOT has more information to relay to council before we finalize any changes to the speed limits on state routes in the village. Huebner and Vaughn have both received feedback from residents about the proposed 25 mile per hour speed limit running the entire north-south route in the corporation. Visitor Andrea Kellogg voiced her opinion that if people have an opinion, they should come to meetings to speak of their concerns. Heubner countered that elected officials are here for the public and there shouldn't be a problem with residents talking to council members and with council members passing those concerns along to everyone during the meetings. Vaughn agreed with Huebner – we are here to represent the public.

Vaughn's opinion is that a new speed study should be done on Wooster Rd so that we have the facts and information to make the best changes to speed zones in the village. Clerk-Treasurer Shaffer, said that since appropriations for 2024 are done, we may need to move funds around to cover the cost of the speed study. Troyer will check with the Holmes County Engineer to see if we can use the permissive funds to cover the cost of the speed study.

Motion to order a speed study to be completed on Wooster Road from the north corporation limit to Uhl St made by Vaughn. Polen seconded the motion. All voted yes. Motion carried.

The speed-limit discussion will be tabled until the speed study results are back and David Hoffman can attend a meeting with additional information.

Mayor Huebner asked Hoffee for an explanation for her no vote. Hoffee stated the same reason as every other year. She feels the appropriations should not be more than the estimated revenue, even though there is a carry over cash balance. Shaffer provided Council with a history of the last 8 years of annual revenue vs. estimated revenue; year end cash balances; and appropriations vs. actual expenditures. The percentage of total approved appropriations vs. expended on average over 8 years is 80.90%. In addition, the total appropriations for 2024 are \$207,831 less than in 2023.
