DISCUSSION: Proposed New Council Rules were included in the meeting packet. If anyone has any questions or concerns after reviewing the minutes and rules of the council, please reach out to Council member Vaughn. He will make a list of concerns or questions, and they will discuss them at the next council meeting. Council member Kellogg stated that she thinks when the time comes, each change that has been made should be voted on individually rather than vote on all the rule changes together. Council member Vaughn said anything old is out the window. These are the new rules. Kellogg stated that she and Shoemaker attended the meeting, and she felt left in the dark like they were not being transparent, she does not agree with parts of the rules, but she will call Vaughn with her concerns. For example, Kelloggs asked if ORC text would be included in the rules. Troyer said that he thought the consensus was to include them in the appendices. Curry, who prepared the draft of the new rules, asked if the entire text should be included or just the references. Either way, she will need to add these appendices as they

are not in the current draft. Curry suggested that only ORC references be included in the new council rules so that they will not require revision anytime ORC is updated. Kellogg and Vaughn are to discuss this topic further before the next meeting. Kellogg said that she would like to see 'Confidential Matters' in executive session as defined by ORC in the rules Executive session in the appendices.

DISCUSSION: Hoffee read – by title only – Ord 2025-103 and asked for a motion to either vote on the Ordinance or table it and refer it back to Planning and Zoning. **Shoemaker made a motion to proceed with the vote tonight. Seconded by Vaughn. All voted aye. Motion carried.** Council will be voting on the issue of rezoning this evening.

Motion to pass the Ordinance was brought to the floor by Shoemaker. However, clarification/discussion ensued and no vote took place at this particular time. Troyer clarified that one of three motions can be made: 1) Motion to pass; 2) Motion to pass with modifications; or 3) Motion to deny.

Discussion:

Council member Hofstetter asked if the property has access right of way. Administrator Troyer stated that the property is not land-locked; there is a legal access easement in place.

Olivia Biltz addressed council and provided a printout to council members to remind them of the point she brought during the public hearing on this topic. Zoning code to protect public health safety comfort prosperity and general welfare of the residents of the Village of Millersburg. By protecting the property rights of all individuals by assuring compatibility of uses and practices within districts approving this special use district will not be assuring the compatibility of uses and practices within the district because it is right smack in the middle of a single-family residential district. If this gets approved as a special use one neighbor will have a triplex right in their back yard. And what happens in the future? The Biltzs would like to live here for as long as possible and what they are afraid of is if this change is allowed, who is to say more properties around them wouldn't be changed to special use properties down the road. They would like to prevent this from happening as much as possible. 111.02, section D says we need to protect the character of the existing areas. This area is clearly a single-family residential district, so she asks that you protect the character of the neighborhood. 1137.09 Criteria: the council must consider: access, traffic flow, compatibility with adjacent land and how it will affect the public health, safety, and general welfare of the residents. There have been many residents who came to council and said that they do not want this to happen.

James Miller of JDM rentals stated that he was here to discuss the triplex they are proposing. He explained that he first did a title search and a deed search to make sure they had access to the property

which showed that there is access. They paid to have trees taken out. They are trying to help with the need for housing in Millersburg. Miller doesn't want to cause problems. He understands why the residents are upset about the project. He said if it is going to be a big concern he will not do the project even though he feels Millersburg needs more housing. He can look at building a duplex instead of a triplex. Mr. Miller is willing to split the cost of the access drive upkeep, snow removal, and so forth.

Council member Kellogg asked if he'd consider building single-family homes at the location if this rezoning request is denied. Miller said it wouldn't make a difference if you had two single-family homes or a duplex. Kellogg addressed the traffic going in and out of there. Mr. Miller stated that he can put in the contract how many vehicles are allowed. He also planned to install a separate pull-off for them to park. He discussed the potential of a short-term rental establishment but isn't really interested in that. Kellogg mentioned that it has been said that owners of long-term rentals tend to not take care of their properties and she asked what Mr. Miller thought. Mr. Miller stated that he would be on top of any issues. Kellogg thanked Mr. Miller for coming. Miller thanks council for listening.

Jason Biltz wanted Mr. Miller to know that he is not trying to limit his development. He is just asking that the board deny the change of zoning to special use. He fully supports the development of single-family homes. There is sufficient space back there for a single-family home. If multiple single-family homes are built on those lots, Biltz has no problem with that. This rezoning issue is for the development plan submitted for a triplex. If there is a new plan for a duplex, it has not been submitted. Therefore, the rezoning should be denied, a new plan should be submitted, and the process should start over. We are not here today to decide on a duplex. The plan that was presented shows a triplex. Hofstetter asked if a triplex and or a duplex would both require a zoning change. Administrator Nate Troyer said they would both require a zoning change. Hofstetter asked if the motion is denied, can Mr. Miller come back to planning and zoning and resubmit new plans? Administrator Troyer said yes, he can resubmit. Conn asked Mr. Miller, "do you want us to vote on this or do you want us to rescind your application. Mr. Miller said he doesn't want people mad at him and he doesn't understand the difference between two single-family homes and a triplex. Mr. Biltz stated that he is simply setting a precedence so that in the future more properties do not become special use. Conn asked Mr. Miller again what it was he wanted council to do today. Does he want to change his plans or have council vote? Mr. Miller stated he wants to go to the duplex. Conn said then I think our job here is done today. It was stated that a duplex will still require a change in zoning. Mr. Biltz added that a change like this is a change to the development plan which was what the zoning board approved. A change to a duplex changes the development plan therefore needs to be reevaluated by the zoning and planning board. Biltz said that if a new development plan for a duplex is submitted, which would still require a zoning change, his opposition will remain the same.

Vaughn made a motion to approve the rezoning request (RS-3 to SU). Conn seconded the motion. Vaughn, Conn, Shoemaker, Polen, and Hofstetter voted no. Kellogg voted aye. Motion failed. Mayor Hoffee clarified that the zoning map will not be amended.
